

FAFSA Checklist

- Bring all W-2s, state tax returns (IT-201) and federal tax returns (IRS 1040)
- Student's Social Security Number
- Both parents' Social Security Numbers, if they have them
- Parents' birthday (month, day and year)
- Date and year the parents got married (if married) or date and year they became separated (if separated)
- Alien Registration Number (green card number) for noncitizen students and parents
- Letters from the government documenting benefits your family receives
- Proof of receive educational credits, child support, taxable earnings, and untaxed income
- Parents' total current balance of cash, savings, and checking accounts
- Net worth of parents' investments, including real estate
- Net worth of parents' current businesses and/or investment farms
- Have you had another child that has attended a college? If you have, try to get the information you used when you applied for a FAFSA PIN
- Have a list of the schools your child is applying to. Some private schools may require extra steps.
