Tentative CEP Goals 2017-2018

By June 26, 2018:

- The Math Department will collaboratively develop a rubric to improve the articulation of students' approach to multi-step, real-world problems as measured by a 5% increase of 75 or higher on the Regents.
- 100% of The Cinema School teachers will have participated in collaborative planning for school culture events.
- A minimum of 100% of the teaching staff will have participated in voluntary professional development (attended, planned, or facilitated) that supports rigorous instruction.
- At least 75% of the teaching staff will have an overall Measures of Teaching Practice (MOTP) score of 2.75 or above in components 3B and 3C of the Danielson Framework for Teaching.
- The majority of our parents will access information about their child's progress in school, as evidenced by a minimum of 66% who log into PupilPath.

II- **CEP Goals Check-In and Related Business (5:10pm)**

- **Passed around Departmental Rubrics from staff PD.**
 - **KW (to students): How often do you see these rubrics?**
 1. **NM & MM - mention that they see the English rubrics a lot and the Social Studies Rubrics to a lesser extent.**
 2. **KW Our next step is to look at student work and then look at the "best" piece of writing that teachers have encountered. We want to determine what OUR best looks like vs. The city/state/country/world, etc.**
- **Mr. Linville is going to a Mathalicious PD soon. This entails higher level thinking and practical applications.**
- **Mathalicious is here to stay - message from superintendent. We were to "get our feet wet" this year. No specific guidelines. Next year, we're anticipating that there will be more specific guidelines.**
- **Impressions - WL - It's been good to make really complex problems and get students to apply mathematical reasoning to society.**
 - **This makes the students more civic minded.**
 - **It's too soon if this impacts student achievement.**
 - **In terms of programming, it's nice to do when there's a double period. We can't really do that anymore.**
- **Sunshine fund: Teachers donate a little bit of money for nice events and gestures.**

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- Ms. Jones has taken point on this and has really done a good job of arranging and organizing these events, as well as “March Madness” events with students and teachers.
- Mrs. Cohen-Agha has been running a discussion lab month for teachers to observe what she does to prepare students to engage in discussions.
 - Impressions:
 1. Stebel - talks about notes he took during a fishbowl. VERY high level conversations going on.
 2. Linville - LOTS of different strategies for getting students to link concepts and vocabulary words.
 - We’re going to a Science-based discussion and a Film-based discussion in an upcoming PD.
- We’re still holding at 36% on PupilPath/IO Education parent enrollment.
 - One of the things that’s puzzling is a seeming aversion to information. It’s such a powerful piece to have your child’s data at your fingertips.

 - We lost \$6500.
 - There’s still a lot of money in the \$13,376 line for AP for All.
 1. We are going to work on vertical alignment to discuss and institute schoolwide AP Skills for each content area.
